NJCAA Track & Field Coaches Association Constitution

USTFCCCA NJCAA TRACK & FIELD HANDBOOK

NJCAA Track & Field Coaches Association Constitution

(updated 4/1/2015)

Article I - Name & Purpose

The name of this organization shall be the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Track and Field Coaches Association. Its objective shall be to foster Track and Field to its highest level in Junior Colleges throughout the nation, to place at the disposal of coaches, sources of track and field information, to advise through recommendation, the National Junior College Athletic Association Standing Committee on Track and Field.

Article II - Membership Dues/Membership

- a. The Annual **Membership Dues** shall be a flat fee of **\$150.00** per school. ALL TRACK AND FIELD PROGRAMS (regardless of the Division, Season(s) or Gender). If any school does not pay their dues, the Coach and Athlete will **NOT** be eligible to receive any Track and Field Coaches Association Awards or gifts. The NJCAA office will collect all membership dues. The NJCAA office will maintain a current list of all paid Coach's association members and provide access to that list to association officers for approved use. Any suggested changes to the membership dues in the future must be presented and approved by the respective NJCAA sport committee and board of directors at the annual meeting of the NJCAA. Membership is on a yearly basis and shall be automatically canceled by non-payment of dues.
- b. **Membership:** The membership shall include all head and assistant Track and Field Coaches of schools that have officially paid their membership dues. All members shall have the privilege of discussion at all meetings of the association.

Article III - Amendments

- a. Proposed amendment or revisions can be proposed at any of the annual meetings, and a vote will take place. The constitution shall be amended by a simple majority of at least 50% of members casting a vote. The paid up members present at the regular annual meeting shall constitute a quorum for conducting the business of the association. A poll of the membership may also be taken on any question when the executive committee deems it necessary.

Article IV - Voting

- a. Eligible to vote: The paid up members present at the regular annual meeting shall constitute a quorum whenever voting is necessary at any of the official meetings. All paid up schools will be allowed one vote per team. (Male and Female)
- b. Acceptable method for voting between official meetings: In addition to the regular meetings of the association, the officers may present, via e-mail, mail or any other appropriate method, communication to the membership for a vote on any item that affects the welfare of the association or the sport we represent.

Article V - Official Meetings & Agendas

a. When/Where: There shall be two regular meetings of the Association each year. The first meeting shall be held in March in conjunction with the NJCAA Indoor Championship Meet in the city in which the meet is held. The second meeting shall be held in May in conjunction with the NJCAA Outdoor Championship Meet, in the city in which the meet is held. In addition to the two official meetings there will be a meeting held at the USTFCCCA Convention that we encourage all Members to attend. Also, the association president or the executive committee may present, via mail, to the membership for a vote any item that affects the welfare of the association or the sport we represent.

In general, the usual order of business at the annual meeting of the membership shall proceed as follows:

- 1) Report of Secretary
 - a) Reading of minutes
- 2) Report of Treasurer
 - a) Treasury Report
- 3) Report of the President
 - a) Report of Chairman of NJCAA Track & Field Committee
- 4) Committee reports
- 5) Old business
- 6) Election of Officers
- 7) New business

An agenda should be prepared in advance and presented to the membership consistent with the above.

Article VI - Officers/Elections

- a) Slate of Officers: The following officers will make up the Executive Committee.
 - i) President
 - ii) Vice President (Div. I)
 - iii) Vice President (Div. III)
 - iv) Secretary
 - v) Treasurer
- b) Election of Officers:
 - i) Elections will be conducted by the NJCAA Office on the even number years.
 - ii) Schedule
 - (1) November 1 – Electronic call for nominations
 - (2) November 15 – Electronic ballot sent
 - (3) December 1 – Vote compiled
 - (4) December 10 – Election results announced.
 - iii) Officers within the association will serve in succession with only the lowest vacancy(s) being filled by election.
 - iv) The newly elected officers will take effect August 1st of the year following the election.

- v) If the office of the President is vacated during the two-year term, the Vice-President (Div. I) will fill that position with the remaining officers moving up in succession. The Treasurer position may remain vacant until the next regularly scheduled election unless the officers feel it is in the best interest of the association to appoint someone to fill the remainder of the term. If this occurs, this person is only in place until the present term expires.
- vi) Officers may serve no more than two terms at the same elected position.
- vii) The President's position can only be filled by a Full-time college employee DI coach

Article VII - Duties of the Officers

- a. Elected Officers are responsible for the following:
 - i. Conducting business in accordance with written bylaws.
 - ii. Reviewing and updating those bylaws annually by vote of the coach's association membership.
 - iii. Conducting business in a fiscally responsible manner and in accordance with the written financial guidelines as mandated by the NJCAA Office.
 - iv. The President's position can only be filled by a Full-time college employee DI coach
- b. President:
 - i. Communicate via e-mail the exact date, time and place of the annual meeting to members at least 60 days in advance of said meeting.
 - ii. Preside at all the scheduled meetings.
 - iii. Act as an ex-officio member of all committees.
 - iv. Represent the association at the annual National Junior College Association meetings.
 - v. Represent the association at the annual USTFCCCA Convention.
 - vi. Attend the NJCAA Div. I Indoor and Outdoor national meeting and meet.
 - vii. Must update NJCAA Coaches Website Regularly
- c. Vice President (Div. I):
 - i. Serve as a member of the executive committee and any other committee to which he/she is named.
 - ii. In case of absence, or incapacitation of the president, he/she will fill the presidential position.
 - iii. Perform other duties designated by the president.
 - iv. Represent the association at the annual USTFCCCA Convention.
 - v. Attend the NJCAA Div. I Indoor and Outdoor national meeting and meet.
- d. Vice President (Div. III):
 - i. Serve as a member of the executive committee and any other committee(s) to which he/she is named.
 - ii. Perform other duties designated by the President.
 - iii. Represent the Division III Programs at all meetings
- e. Secretary:
 - i. Serve as a member of the executive committee and any other committee(s) to which he/she is named.
 - ii. Act as a repository for all minutes, records, and publications of the association.

- iii. Take the minutes of all meetings. A complete copy of the minutes must be sent to the NJCAA Office within 30 days of the meeting for posting to the NJCAA website. E-mail minutes to the officers for review before sending it to the NJCAA.
- iv. Represent the association at the annual USTFCCCA Convention.
- v. Attend the NJCAA Div. I Indoor and Outdoor national meeting and meet.
- f. Treasurer:
 - i. Serve as a member of the executive committee and any other committee(s) to which he/she is named.
 - ii. Present current financial report to the membership at the annual meetings.
 - iii. Review NJCAA report of due payments submitted by member colleges.
 - iv. Report any unpaid college at the annual meetings.
 - v. Represent the association at the annual USTFCCCA Convention
 - vi. Contact any Colleges with unpaid dues prior to Annual Meeting

Article VIII - Hall of Fame:

- 1) Process for submitting nomination:
 - a) All Hall of Fame nominations forms must be submitted to the NJCAA National Office regardless of Division
- 2) Timeline:
 - a) Nomination forms must be submitted to the NJCAA National Office not later than November 15th of that year for the nominee to be considered for that year. Any nomination that is not voted into the Hall of Fame will be held over for the next three years.
- 3) Selection process/selection criteria/selection committee:
 - a) Hall of Fame committee will review all nominations submitted to the National Office for consideration.
 - b) Selection Criteria:
 - i) Coaches and Officials to be considered as a nominee should have some of the following:
 - (1) At least 4 years of service as a junior college coach
 - (2) Has to have either served as an officer in the coaches association, hosted a championship meet, or done something significant to better junior college cross country or track and field
 - (3) Must not have had major violations or behavior that would denigrate the NJCAA prior to, during, or up to the point of being nominated for the Hall of Fame.
 - (4) Must have showed a level of integrity in coaching and life that would be worthy of the Hall of Fame award
 - ii) Athletes to be considered as a nominee should have some of the following:
 - (1) Must have been an All-American more than once.
 - (2) Must have won a national championship either in a relay or an Individual event.
 - (3) Has to have made a significant contribution either at the university they went to, or internationally for their country.
 - (4) Has to have been out of the NJCAA school at least 4 years

- (5) Must not have had major violations or behavior that would denigrate the NJCAA prior to, during, or up to the point of being nominated for the Hall of Fame.
- (6) Must have showed a level of integrity in life that would be worthy of the Hall of Fame award
- c) Selection Committee: Current NJCAA Officers and a NJCAA staff member as a non-voting member.
- d) Awards:
 - i) A Plaque will be awarded to the recipients.
- e) Recognition Process:
 - i) Will make effort to present award at one of the national meets or national meetings.

Article IX - Finances

- a. Expenses associated with travel will be monitored and approval in accordance with the NJCAA travel and business expense policies, principles of ethical behavior and volunteer reimbursement request guidelines. Should at any time the association become overextended financially, the NJCAA has the authority to revoke the association's privilege to do business in the name of the National Junior College Athletic Association. In preapproved circumstances, the NJCAA may agree to extend credit to a coaches association until the next year's membership dues are accrued.
- b. Coaches Association has agreed to provide reimbursement to the Officers attending the USTFCCCA Convention for up to \$1000.00 per person. Expenses associated with this travel will be monitored and approved in accordance with the NJCAA travel and business expenses policies.
- c. All other program expenditures, in excess of \$1000.00, must be approved in advance by a vote of the membership at the coach's association annual meeting. Under extenuating circumstances, an electronic vote of the coach's association members will be allowed with prior approval from the NJCAA Office.

Article X - NJCAA Website – Coaches Association Page:

- 1) It is the responsibility of each coaches association to review on a monthly basis the information contained on the NJCAA website – Coaches Association Page, for accuracy and completeness. Any corrections or changes must be immediately communicated to the NJCAA Office.
- 2) Social Media:
 - a) The NJCAA currently has an active presence on Facebook and Twitter and continue to monitor other social media offerings. In order to present a unified front, the NJCAA coaches associations will not be approved to have accounts outside of those administered by the NJCAA National Office. Coaches association representatives are encourage to forward stories, information, etc. conducive to social media to the NJCAA National Office for posting.

Article XI – Committees

Section 1. Association's Governing Body

The executive committee as constituted by Article VII shall be the association's governing body.

Section 2 Committees

- 1) Academic Track and Field All-American Committee - Three active NJCAA Track and Field coaches will review, update, and distribute committee guidelines, information and awards to member coaches and the Academic Track and Field All- Americans.
- 2) Games Committee - The Games Committee will preside over the management of championship events. The following position will be appointed for each championship to make up the Games Committee: NJCAA Representative or Designee, President of Coaches Association, two Vice-Presidents.
- 3) Hall of Fame Committee –The NJCAA Track & Field coaches Association Officers will review, update guidelines, and distribute information to the association's body for the NJCAA Track and Field Hall of Fame Selection(s). All Hall of Fame (HOF) nomination forms must be submitted to the National office no later than November 15th of that year for the nominee to be concenter for that year. Any nominee that is not voted into the HOF will be held over for the next three (3) years.
- 4) Jury of Appeals Committee – NJCAA Representative or Designee, Meet Director, and one person appointed by the other members, not to be a coach in the meet.
- 5) Records Committee - The Records Committee will be composed of one women's coach and one men's coach. Each coach will be responsible for securing present NJCAA records, past NJCAA records, and National Junior or Community College records in their respective division. These records will be reviewed and updated two weeks after each national championship and then passed on to the National Secretary for recording in the minutes.
- 6) Special Awards - The Executive Committee will appoint a committee chair to solicit and give special recognition awards, i.e. - National Meet Directors, long term officials, etc.
- 7) Standards and New Events Committee - The Executive Committee will appoint a chair and designees to review and update standards by using the NJCAA formula for standards procedure. New events will be discussed and brought before the body at the national meetings.

Section 3

The President or the Executive Committee has the power to appoint any other committee deemed advisable or essential to the welfare of the association and the sport of Track and Field.



NJCAA Track and Field Computer Rankings

USTFCCCA NJCAA TRACK & FIELD HANDBOOK

General Terms

National team computer rankings are based on mathematical formulae that awards place points and bonus points to season-best performances from the NJCAA descending order lists of performances. The rankings are compiled using only performance data submitted to the Track and Field Results Reporting System (TFRRS). *Only three performances in an individual event from each institution are considered.*

Regional team computer rankings (or regional index) are compiled and released on the same national-ranking date. Regional rankings are based on the same mathematical formulae used in compiling national rankings; however, teams within a specific region are only evaluated against those other teams in the same region. Regional assignments are determined by the USTFCCCA National Office in conjunction with the NJCAA Track and Field Executive Committee. *Only three performances in an individual event from each institution are considered.*

Indoor Track and Field

NJCAA indoor track and field team computer rankings are released by the USTFCCCA national office on Wednesdays during the indoor track and field season. Dates are predetermined by the USTFCCCA National Office in conjunction with the NJCAA Track and Field Executive Committee.

Regular Rankings: *Released weekly on Wednesdays beginning five (5) weeks prior to the NJCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships and ending with the Tuesday prior to the NJCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships (six (6) releases). The final regular season ranking is reflective of entries into the NJCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships.*

Outdoor Track and Field

NJCAA outdoor track and field team computer rankings are released by the USTFCCCA national office on Wednesdays during the outdoor track and field season. Dates are predetermined by the USTFCCCA National Office in conjunction with the NJCAA Track and Field Executive Committee.

Regular Rankings (Division I): *Released weekly on Wednesdays beginning eight (8) weeks prior to the NJCAA DI Outdoor Track and Field Championships and ending with the Monday prior to the NJCAA DI Outdoor Track and Field Championships (nine (9) releases). The final ranking is reflective of entries into the NJCAA DI Outdoor Track and Field Championships.*

Regular Rankings (Division III): *Released weekly on Wednesdays beginning five (5) weeks prior to the NJCAA DIII Outdoor Track and Field Championships and ending with the Monday prior to the NJCAA DIII Outdoor Track and Field Championships (six (6) releases). The final ranking is reflective of entries into the NJCAA DIII Outdoor Track and Field Championships.*

Regional Athletes of the Year

Selection

1. Selected by an institutional vote of regional USTFCCCA NJCAA Track and Field member coaches and awarded to two (2) student-athletes (one (1) track events and one (1) field events) per gender per region for the NJCAA Indoor Track and Field season.
 - a. Multi-events (i.e., pentathlon and heptathlon) are considered field events for the purposes of this award.
2. Institutions are divided into regional assignments as determined by the USTFCCCA National Office in conjunction with the NJCAA Track and Field Executive Committee.
3. Nominations are submitted via online ballot ending the Friday prior to the indoor championships. Voting is conducted online via a ballot compiled by the national office the Monday prior to the Indoor Championships.
4. Only head coaches may vote

Award Distribution

Awards are distributed at the NJCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships' coaches meeting.

Regional Assistant Coaches of the Year

Selection

1. Selected by an institutional vote of regional USTFCCCA NJCAA Track and Field member coaches and awarded to one (1) assistant coach per gender per region for the NJCAA Indoor Track and Field season.
2. Institutions are divided into regional assignments as determined by the USTFCCCA National Office in conjunction with the NJCAA Track and Field Executive Committee.
3. Nominations are submitted via online ballot ending the Friday prior to the indoor championships. Voting is conducted online via a ballot compiled by the national office the Monday prior to the Indoor Championships.
4. Only head coaches may vote

Award Distribution

Awards are distributed at the NJCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships' coaches meeting.

Selection

 - c) Must not have had major violations or behavior that would denigrate the NJCAA prior to, during, or up to the point of being nominated for the Hall of Fame.
 - d) Must have showed a level of integrity in coaching and life that would be worthy of the Hall of Fame award
- 2) For Athletes to be considered as a nominee they should have some of the following:
 - a) Must have won a national championship either in a relay or an Individual event.
 - b) Must have been an All-American more than once.
 - c) Had to have made a significant contribution either at the university they went to, or internationally for their country.
 - d) Has to have been out of the NJCAA school at least 4 years
 - e) Must not have had major violations or behavior that would denigrate the NJCAA prior to, during, or up to the point of being nominated for the Hall of Fame.
 - f) Must have showed a level of integrity in life that would be worthy of the Hall of Fame award
