Oregon, under coach Robert Johnson, completes the academic year all-sport "Triple Crown" as winners of the cross country national championships in 2016, indoor track & field winners in March 2017, and now this crown ... Texas won national crowns in all three sports in 1990, but not in the same academic year.

Oregon's third outdoor title in team history (2015, 1985) ... Oregon has recorded nine-straight podium finishes ...

Georgia (coach Petros Kyprianou) recorded the most points in meet history in field events, their entire team score ... the previous high of field-event points in a single championship was 59 by Arizona State in 2008 ... Georgia lands on the podium for the second-straight year with their best finish in meet history ... Georgia's sweep of titles in the high jump, long jump, triple jump and heptathlon was the first of its kind in history...

Southern California (coach Caryl Smith Gilbert) notches best team finish since finishing runner-up in 2006 ... Kentucky (coach Edrick Floreal) records second podium finish in team history, their first was in 2015 (runner-up)

Oregon won its seventh title in the event, extending their all-time lead ... best event finish in Virginia Tech history -- Green was second last year ... second time in meet history teammates finish in top 3 in the event (Tennessee, 1982)

Schweizer is only the fourth in Division I history to accomplish the feat, joining Villanova's Jennifer Rhines in 1994-95, Arizona's Amy Skieresz in 1996-97, and Texas Tech's Sally Kipyego in 2007-08 ... Schweizer is first Mizzou champion in the event since Sabrina Dornhoefer in 1985 and second overall ... Schweizer was third last year ...

Best event finish in Eastern Michigan history and best in any event since Lela Nelson won the heptathlon in 2005

Houston wins the event for the first time since 1982 (Stanley Floyd anchor) ... Houston anchor Cameron Burrell is the son of Cougar coach Leroy Burrell ... best finish by Auburn in the event since Harvey Glance anchored the squad to runner-up showings in 1978 and 1979 ... best finish in any event in North Carolina A&T history -- was fifth in the 4x100 in 2001 ... first time in meet history the top seven went sub-39 ... two-time defending champion LSU did not finish due to a dropped baton ...

Kerr is the first to sweep indoor mile and outdoor 1500 meter titles since Texas' Leo Manzano in 2008 New Mexico's first title outdoors in event history -- previous best finish was Lee Emanuel's third-place showing in 2009 after Emanuel won the indoor mile ... best finish by Michigan State in the event since Warren Druetzler won in 1951 (mile) ... best finish in Ole Miss history in the event ...

Holloway is the first freshman in DI history to take both indoor and outdoor sprint hurdle races ... Holloway was second in the long jump on Wednesday ... biggest headwind for a final since Andrew Riley won in 2012 with a 3.5 m/s headwind ...

Coleman is the first to sweep indoor 60 and outdoor 100 titles in the same year since Florida's Jeff Demps in 2010 ... Sixth 100 meter title in Tennessee history, first since Justin Gatlin won in 2002, only USC with 8 has more ... best Houston finish in the event since Sam Jefferson won in 1994 ... Belcher also anchored A&T's 4x1 to 3rd place showing.

Eric Futch is the first to win back-to-back crowns in the event since Washington State's Jeshua Anderson (2008, 2009) ... first time in meet history top three scorers under 48.55 ... Florida now sits alone on top of the event's all-time wins table with 5 -- all of which have come since 2002 ... best finish in event history for UCLA since 2007 ... best finish in Arkansas program history in the event since Lee Yoder finished runner-up in 1952.
